




## SENSITIVITY & CONSISTENCY

#### Do:

- ✓ Remain objective
- ✓ Back up your assessment by referencing:
  - APSI's expectations of the level
  - Where the lesson falls short of the level
  - What can be done to bring the lesson up to the level domore of this.
- ✓ With extremely weak teaching choose the most important one/two (max) areas for development that would have the biggest impact on the candidate's teaching
- ✓ Identify the strength(s) of the lesson (always at least one!) so candidates can repeat them





## SENSITIVITY & CONSISTENCY (CONTINUED)

#### **Avoid:**

- Negative feedback keep it constructive
- Criticising or deconstructing every single aspect of the lesson
- Writing a complete start to finish re-run of the lesson
